Barbara Bayers, BS/MS Music Ed, Master of Arts in Learning, has been an organist/choir director for 60+ years and is a very active substitute organist. She is an active member and serves on the Executive Board of the Delaware Chapter of the American Guild of Organists. Barb was twice Past-Dean of the Bridgeport Chapter AGO in her home state of CT, where she has been a member for 60+ years. She retired from teaching middle school choral/general music in CT after 34 years in several Fairfield County school districts. In her free time, Barb enjoys traveling, camping in

their 5 th wheel camper, bicycling, reading, and being in the company of good friends. Barb and her husband Mark Douyard are active members of The Presbyterian Church in Dover.



Ryan Pryslak is currently the Organist and Director of Music at Immanuel Episcopal Church, Highlands where he oversees all aspects of the music program and directs the Immanuel Choir. Previously, Ryan served as the Organist and Director or Music Ministries at Church of the Covenant from June 2017 to this past January. He is a graduate of the University of Delaware with a Bachelor of Arts in Music, majoring in voice and choral conducting with a minor in church music. During his tenure at

Covenant, Ryan has supervised major restoration to the 1977 Schantz Organ as well as spearhead new Video and Sound projects during COVID which brought worship to the church during quarantine. In 2017, Ryan began the ever popular "Arts at Covenant" Concert Series which is now planning for its Sixth Season and provides accessible performing arts events to the North Wilmington Area, champions music of Women and BIPOC composers, and offer educational opportunities for youth and adults alike in the Bellefonte and Edgemoor Communities. Ryan was the founder and director of The Opus One Vocal Arts, a community-based Chamber Choir that performed throughout the area from 2005-2015. He was also the founder and music director for The Mid Atlantic Chamber Singers. His teachers include Patrick Evans, Nicole Aldrich (voice); Sharon Parker (piano); David Herman, David Christopher, Matthew Glandorf (organ); Paul Head (choral conducting). Ryan is a full time financial advisor for Citizens Bank and has a strong background in finance and investments from his over 17+ years career in the banking industry. Ryan and his lovely wife, Jessica are parents to two children (Greyson & Addison) and sheepadoodle named Preston, and reside in North Wilmington.



T.J. Thomas serves as Minister of Music at Saint Peter's Episcopal Church, Lewes, DE. He oversees a vibrant music program including several choirs, a concert series, and the annual residency of a prominent Anglican Church musician. Prior to St. Peter's, T.J. was Interim Director of Music at the Lutheran Church of the Holy Spirit in Emmaus, Pennsylvania. During his undergraduate career, he served on the music staff at St. Stephen's Episcopal Pro-Cathedral (Wilkes-Barre, PA) under the direction of his organ teacher and mentor, Canon Mark Laubach. An active member of the

Royal School of Church Music in America, T.J. functions as Liturgist and Co-Music Manager for the King's College Course every summer. He is active in the American Guild of Organists and Association of Anglican Musicians. T.J. received his Bachelor's degree in Music from Marywood University (Scranton, PA). He was received into the Episcopal Church in 2006.

Member Spotlight David Herman, *in memoriam* by Ryan Pryslak



H. David Herman, Distinguished Professor Emeritus of Music and former University Organist at the University of Delaware for 25 years, He was born Oct. 24, 1944 in Williamsport, PA and died on April 8, 2024 in Newark, DE.

And everyone who lives and believes in me shall never die. Do you believe this? ~ John 11:26

The Delaware AGO and greater music community lost a giant of our field last month. Dr. David Herman passed away peacefully on April 8th after a courageous battle with cancer. As a former student of David's, I wanted to offer my personal tribute to him and the amazing life he lived. I would not be the person and musician I am today if I did not have him in my life.

Dr. Herman was an enormous source of knowledge and wisdom in the field of Church Music and Organ Performance. Of all the memories I have of my time at the University of Delaware, some of the best were those that involved him and his wife Lauri. I took all of his Church Music courses at UD as well as private lessons and each class was full of tidbit of knowledge (both useful and interesting) as well as life lessons to help his students become better church musicians. For example, when learning about the Liturgical seasons of Church Calendar, he made sure to teach us that Ascension Day in German is Christi Himmelfahrt. I enjoy teaching that word to my children today! I will always remember my lessons in Bayard Sharp Hall and how proud he was about the Dobson Tracker Organ he helped design and see built during his tenure. He was always a patient and encouraging teacher. He also took pride in musical lineage. His teacher at Wittenberg University was Jan Bender, whose teacher back in Germany during the 1930's was Hugo Distler. How amazing to be linked to all three of these storied musicians and considered them "musical family!"

One of my first "church gigs" was with David and Lauri during their time as Organist and Choirmaster at St. Paul's Lutheran Church. I was offered opportunities to grow as a musician and learn so much about the ins and outs of a career as a church musician. Of course, the Hermans knew how to throw a party as well and I remember being invited over to their home for a Christmas Party with the St. Paul's Choir. The food was amazing and the centerpiece was a Wassail Bowl with some of the best mulled wine I have ever tasted.

My most formative experience with David and Lauri was when I spent the month of January 2003 in London as part of UD Study Abroad. This was my first time travelling out of the country for an extended period of time. This trip has been one of the Top 10 most important experiences in my life and it really solidfied my call to be a church musician. While we learned so much about the music, church architecture, and history of liturgy in England during this trip, the real learning happened outside of the classroom...in the pub! One evening we had all gone to Waxy O'Connors near Piccadilly Circus for Sunday Roast and a pint. As a young adult and Catholic at the time, I was struggling with doctrine and being called to be a church

musician in different denominations. I spoke about this with Dr. Herman and how I was always taught that I needed be at my home Catholic church every Sunday or else this would be considered a sin. How could I reconcile this in my heart when I felt called to do the work of the Church? Dr. Herman had deep faith and to this day I will never forget what he told me. His response to was not a direct answer, but one that made me think outside the box. He said that his belief is that being called to the work of the Church is the greatest calling of all. God doesn't care if you are Catholic, Methodist, Lutheran, or Episcopalian. He didn't give me an answer I wanted, but one I needed to hear.

I could go on with many other anecdotes and memories (like when I was part of Carols for the *University* he started at UD, playing a jingle bell with Julie Nishimura on piano!) Dr. Herman was an important mentor and friend to me as he was to all of his students and colleagues. How can we honor his legacy? Be a mentor to a young student and challenge that student to be the best they can be. Instill a love for our field in the next generation.
